- **January 13 – 15:** Focused primarily on swearing in legislators, minor fixes to legislation passed in 2020 session, and a few changes to existing law to accelerate the COVID-19 relief package.
- **February 16 – June 8:** Regular session

Legislative Subcommittee Closely Monitored Bills

- **HB21-1303: Global Warming Potential For Public Project Materials – Passed**
 - Worked with bill sponsors and stakeholders
 - Todd Ohlheiser and Tien Peng (NRMCA) testified
 - Overall, positive outcome
- **HB21-1266: Environmental Justice Disproportionate Impacted Community – Passed**
 - Environmental community and Gov's office crafted legislation. TBD on impact for industry.
- **SB21-260: Sustainability Of The Transportation System – Passed**
 - Supported by industry partners in the CCIC
 - Implements several new transportation fees and General Fund transfers, creates or modifies four state enterprises, and adds new planning and environmental study requirements.
- **SB21-197: Workers' Compensation Physician – Postponed Indefinitely**
 - The bill creates the mechanism by which the injured worker may select the treating physician
 - Worked with business community and bill was postponed indefinitely
- **Dredge and Fill Legislation**
 - CDPHE was unable to secure a bill sponsor
